

#### In-Person Instruction Status Update

- Alameda County in the Red Tier
  - Can return to campus w/ safety plan posted to website
- Building Preparations
  - 16 exterior rooms prioritized, cleaned and sanitized
  - Air purifiers and sanitizer stations
  - HVAC has been serviced to address airflow issues
  - o Interior rooms will need professional analysis before using for instruction
  - CDC/state/county guidelines
- Feedback
  - Staff, family, and student surveys
  - Detailed update went out last week
  - Town hall for 6th grade families next Monday
  - April and May town halls focused on August planning
  - Konstella thread for families to ask questions
- Funding sources
  - Multiple grants supporting this planning and implementation
  - Planning is meeting eligibility requirements of the grants



















- Phase 1 involves utilizing our exterior classrooms with windows to bring around 100 -150 students back to campus for limited instructional time.
- Feedback from families, students, teachers, and counselors in addition to identified academic needs has informed this planning.
- Paras are being recruited to support on campus instruction



















- Regular in-person academic instruction access for interested 6th grade students/families.
  - Equity is focal point for the design process
  - All interested 6th grade families can send their students (pending facility constraints)
  - o 6th grade teachers are on this "on-campus team" on a voluntary basis
  - 78% of 6th grade families have expressed interest
  - Tentative dates are orientation days on April 1 and 2
  - Instruction would start on April 12th (Monday after spring break).
  - Kris Bradburn is partnering with me by taking on a lead role in this planning working closely with Mr. Qiu and Ms. Farmer.



















- Regular in-person support access to prioritized groups of students in need of academic intervention
  - Coordinated by the student support team under Ms. Zaugg's leadership
  - Students have been identified and will be provided intervention supports on-campus and through para support while remote



















- Periodic in-person access for seniors to provide 12th grade ceremonial engagements in April and May. Effort being led by Ms. Snyder and Ms. DeRoos
  - 12th grade teachers part of these engagements
  - Senior meeting earlier this week
  - Planning for possible outside graduation ceremony at City Hall
  - Survey to determine other possible engagements
    - Covid safe Senior Picnic
    - Senior Salute
    - Classes on Campus



- We are simultaneously planning for a Phase 2 and 3 return for August
  - Daily arts and academic instruction for all students
  - Health and safety guidelines will be constraint on planning
    - Planning for multiple scenarios
  - Collaborating with COSATS to establish a planning team to work throughout remainder of the school year to finalize planning.



In order to qualify for the "In-Person Instruction" grant, our phase 1 plan must be board approved by the end of the month.



#### WASC Self-Study

- analyze our school program from every direction
- include stakeholders
- Uncover and identify problem areas
- Produce a report (150 pages plus)
- A committee of educators will visit us for 4 days (May 2-5, 2021)

#### **WASC History:**

- OSA opened in 2002, probably had a preliminary accreditation
- We have had 2 or 3 year accreditations until 2014
- In 2014 we received our first 6 year accreditation
- Filed an Interim Report in 2017
- We were due for our visit last April delayed due to high demand for visits
- Visit changed to Nov. 15-18, 2020, and we began meeting and preparing a year ago then COVID happened
- Current visit is scheduled for May 2-5, 2021
